We completed Leadership PCI Class #5 with an exciting group and looking forward to the sixth class as we continue our mission for PCI. We had the first Teacher and Teacher Assistant of the Year recognition at the Santikos Casablanca Theater and announced our winners for Teacher (HS and EHS) and Teacher Assistant (HS). We expanded our excitement about the STEAM Dream Team which also had the children excited about learning about the wind! You have placed our children and families high in priority, making our mission a reality. I cannot thank you enough. There is a saying "that that does not kill us, makes us stronger."
