From March 3, 2025 to March 5, 2025, the Administration for Children and Families (ACF) conducted a Focus Area One (FA1) monitoring review of Parent/Child Incorporated. This report contains information about the grant recipient's performance and compliance with the requirements of the Head Start Program Performance Standards (HSPPS) or Public Law 110-134, *Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007*.

Based on the information gathered during this review, it has been determined that your program meets the requirements of all applicable HSPPS, laws, regulations, and policy requirements.

Children's Book Day - April 2, 2025


